Updated procedures have been created, in an effort to accommodate all students interested in bagging.

- Students will work a 2-hour shift and there are 20 spots per bagging
- Sign-ups will be at Band Parent Meetings, or by contacting the band parent at the above email or phone number.
- You can sign up for any bagging date that is listed on the website. We ask that you please mark your calendar so you remember that you have signed up for that date. Reminders will be sent out, **but it should be your responsibility to show up for the bagging date you signed up for.**
- It is hoped that parents of scheduled students will **volunteer to chaperone** at the time of their student's shift.
- Bagging dates will be listed on the website.
- **WE ASK THAT EACH STUDENT BAG AT LEAST 2 TIMES IN THE BAND SEASON TO HELP RAISE MONEY FOR THE ENTIRE BAND.**
- **If you cannot make the scheduled bagging please contact the band parent listed above as soon as possible.** Emergencies happen, please just let us know. That way, we can fill the spot if there are other people who would like to bag. We would also know not to expect a student or chaperone and can make arrangements for another chaperone.
- **Please wear tan or black pants, red band polo shirt, and closed shoes.** Some of these requirements come directly from Stop & Shop management and some are just because it looks much nicer if everyone is dressed accordingly. Then, customers know who they are donating their money to. Please follow the requirements; it is what is required for parades and other band functions. If students come dressed inappropriately they will be asked to call home to have the proper clothing brought to them or they will not be able to bag and will simply sit and wait until the shift is over. **The use of cell phones or iPods while bagging is not permitted.** Drinks or food are not allowed at the register. These fundraisers are very important and we need to keep them.
- Please remind your child to **act appropriately** while bagging! It is representation of the entire band, not just themselves.
